## A Reading from the Book of Zephaniah Chapter 3, verse 14-20

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The LORD has taken away the judgements against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. # The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke, Chapter 3, verses 7–18.

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.'

And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.' Even taxcollectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.'

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

#### ADVENT

During each Sunday of the Advent season, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us: Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. Others consider the lighting of the first candle to symbolize expectation, while the second symbolizes hope, the third joy and the fourth purity. The Christ candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day reminding Christians that Jesus is the light of the world. The order and exact wording vary among churches, but the wreath continually reminds us of whom we are called to be as followers of Jesus.

#### VALE BETH CROSS

Beth and Lionel Cross came to the Central Coast in the 80's, when services at St Georges were only held monthly. These services were taken mostly by retired Bishops and clergy. Beth joined with the Parishioners to lobby for more regular services to be held. Stories can be told of the lovely lunches Beth would hold at her home both for the St George Parishioners and the Matcham Tea Club. Beth was Rector's Warden at Matcham and a member of the Terrigal Parish Council for many years, always working hard organising musical nights, Christmas Carols open air movies on the grounds of St Georges. Beth also loved her Sunday School people taking great joy in teaching them and passing on her own love of the Christian faith. Beth will be missed by all of us.

Carlo Carretto, the renowned spiritual writer, spent many years living alone as a hermit in the Sahara desert. He wrote a number of books from that place of solitude, including one entitled, Letters from the Desert. In that book, he has a message for those of us who live busy lives in the world. "What is God trying to say to us in our busy lives?" He suggests this: "Be patient! Learn to wait - for each other, for love, for happiness, for God!" Learn to wait! [Many of our problems flow from the reality that] we often don't wait properly for things.

#### MISSION REPORT - 13th December 2015 ABM - AUSTRALIA: HOPE FOR LIFE

Hope For Life will be a specialised early intervention service designed to assist teen mothers and their support circle to develop a healthy family environment.

A gap in specialised service providers for teenage parents with an unborn child in Moree of been of great concern.

Anglicare in the region has discovered that teenage mothers would welcome support and guidance during this challenging, anxious and unknown period of their lives.

A significant number of Aboriginal teenagers will become clients of Hope for Life and ABM believes this innovative project needs to be supported in its initial three-year pilot to offer further care to Indigenous young women.

The Hope for Life program is one of the two Mission projects (the other program being Youth Engagement in Northern Australia Remote Communities - initiatives for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander youth) the Parish Council elected to support this year through our ongoing regular Missional contributions.

#### THE CHRISTMAS BOWL - ACT FOR PEACE

#### GIVE A REFUGEE CLEAN WATER AND HELP SAVE A LIFE THIS CHRISTMAS

Since 1949, the Christmas bowl appeal has brought

compassionate Christians together to help bring hope and safety to the

world's most vulnerable communities.

The Reverend Frank Byatt of Victoria placed an empty bowl on the dinner table and he humbly asked his family and friends who were present to give what they considered the cost of the meal had been. He urged his guests to reflect on their own good fortunes in being able to share a Christmas meal together in comfort and safety, and he invited them

to do something selfless, to share God's blessings of love and friendship in the form of a gift to bring relief and hope to the people who had fled the horrors of World War II and were suffering as refugees.

This invitation to Australian Christians, to stand by men, women and children living through conflict and displacement is, sadly, more important than ever.

This year the Christmas Bowl is helping families who have fled terrible fighting in Southern Sudan, where in 2015, more than 200,000 people have crossed the border. Many people are desperately trying to keep children healthy while living in squalid, overcrowded refugee camps.
