A Reading from the book of Isaiah Chapter 43, verse 1-7

But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, 'Give them up', and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Psalm: 29

Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven: ascribe to the Lord glory and might. Ascribe to the Lord the honour due to his name: O worship the Lord in the beauty of his holiness. The voice of the Lord is upon the waters: the God of glory thunders, the Lord upon the great waters.

The voice of the Lord is mighty in operation: the voice of the Lord is a glorious voice.

The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar-trees: the Lord breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon. He makes them skip like a calf: Lebanon and Sirion like a young wild ox.

The voice of the Lord divides the lightning-flash: the voice of the Lord whirls the sands of the desert, the Lord whirls the desert of Kadesh.

The voice of the Lord rends the terebinth trees, and strips bare the forests: in his temple all cry 'Glory.'

The Lord sits enthroned above the water-flood: the Lord sits enthroned as a king for ever. The Lord will give strength to his people: the Lord will give to his people the blessing of peace.

Glory to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit as in the beginning, so now and forever. Amen

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles Chapter 8, 14 verses to 17;

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke, Chapter 3, verses 15–22.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people. But Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things that Herod had done, added to them all by shutting up John in prison.

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

Dear Friends in Christ

We have reached the end of another Advent and Christmas Season. Thank you to all who offered their gifts and talents to make our worship and church so beautiful. Each of you are such a blessing to this parish.

Advent is given to us as a yearly four-week period to focus on waiting in joyful hope, but we do it every day. Our daily waiting throughout the rest of this year flows from the waiting we did during Advent and prepares us for the next Advent when we will intensify again our waiting in joyful hope.

St. Paul, maybe better than any other writer, illustrates our lifetime stance of waiting in joyful hope. In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes,

"... [Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God" (5:1-2).

Christmas is given to us as a yearly two- to three-week period to focus on spreading the new light of Jesus through our words and deeds, but we do it every day. Our daily sharing of Jesus' light throughout the rest of this year flows from the sharing we did during Christmas and prepares us for the next Christmas Season when we will focus again on the birth of the new light of Christ.

Again, St. Paul illustrates our need to share the new light. In his second letter to the Corinthians, Paul writes: "... We proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (4:5-6).

May we continue to shine as one in Christ that God's will be done.

Please continue to pray for Fr Mark as he prepares to come among us as our new Rector.

On a personal level words cannot express our sincere thanks for your beautiful cards, best wishes, and gifts given to Keith and I this Christmas. But the best gift of all was being able to share with you in Word and in the sacrament of the Eucharist, the greatest gift of all the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CA – Church Army AUSTRALIA

Conrad Parsons – CA CEO writes

The Church Army have been 'sowing the fields to plant the next crop of evangelists'.

The motto – "God leads God's mission"

Every step we take in rebuilding Church Army, finding and training new evangelists, is made while we are praying. We invite the Lord in our prayers to lead us forward in the right direction and at the right pace.

Conrad also writes that evangelists are more plentiful than we once thought and they are largely hidden within local churches, trying to find their place of service in God's Kingdom.

Our Diocesan Bishop Greg Thompson, introduced to the Synod the concept of the bonfire.

The Church Army has also ignited the bonfire in Newcastle, the birthplace of the Church Army. The first Bonfire evangelist gathering was hosted by Michael and Alison Marklew in their home. Michael is an ordination Candidate.

Michael said he was "most encouraged that every person who attended was keen to grow as an evangelist and to see new evangelists identified, encouraged and equipped to build our churches."

Conrad spoke at the meeting held in Newcastle, and also a meeting in the Blue Mountains, about the Church Army's vision and plan to identify and equip new evangelists in the local church.

World Vision
