#### LIGHTING OF THE THIRD ADVENT CANDLE

THE BLIND SEE AGAIN. Many of the Jewish people did not expect a Messiah like Jesus. Many wondered: 'Are you the one who is to come?' Jesus came not to exercise sovereignty and power over the people but to bring blessing to the poor and needy. Let us celebrate his birth this Christmas by being good news for the poor.

We have lit the candles of *hope* and *peace*. Today we light the candle of *joy*. In today's Epistle St Paul exhorts the Philippians to "rejoice always". The Latin for "rejoice" is *Gaudete*, so the Third Sunday in Advent has been called Gaudete Sunday. We rejoice not because things are always going well, but because the Lord has come, the Lord is coming, and the Lord will come. Knowing that the Lord is near eliminates worry and fear.

Joy is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the joy we find in Jesus Christ. The third candle is lit.

Thank you God, for the joy you give us. As we await the fulfillment of your promise, keep our joy alive. Help us today and every day, to worship you, to hear your word, and to do your will by sharing your joy with others. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Sentence

Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, 'Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God.'

# A reading from Isaiah Chapter 35. Verses 1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing.

The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.

They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God.

Strengthen the weak hands,
and make firm the feeble knees.

Say to those who are of a fearful heart,
'Be strong, do not fear!

Here is your God.

He will come with vengeance,
with terrible recompense.

# Finding joy in resilience

Is it possible to be joyful when the natural disaster that batter your island home become more destructive with every year? Your Christmas Bowl gifts help vulnerable people of Tonga to stay safe through worsening disasters. People like Asena, who has found great joy in protecting her family and caring for her neighbours.

#### **GAUDETE SUNDAY**

Today, the Third Sunday of Advent, is sometimes known as Gaudete Sunday. *Gaudete* is the Latin word for "rejoice." The name comes from the introit or entrance hymn in the old liturgy. It comes from St Paul's letter to the Philippians: *Gaudete in Domino semper* or "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Phil. 4:4). The focus of Advent is the coming of Jesus in his incarnation in the womb of his Blessed Mother; his coming to his Church in the Holy Spirit made present to us by faith and repentance, the ministry of word, prayer and sacrament; and his final Advent at the end of time.

The late Dutch priest and writer, Henri Nouwen, said there is a difference between joy and happiness: happiness depends on external circumstances, our health, our wealth, our relationships and so on. Joy is not finally dependant on those externals, but on knowing that God loves us without condition and that even adversity and sickness, stress, injustice, violence and even death itself, can never take it away from us. In his letter to the Romans, Paul says, "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose" (Rm 8:28). It is possible to know joy even in our sadness. This Sunday of joy can remind us not to fret and fuss

over all the things we've not yet done to prepare for Christmas, but to think of all the good things we have in life, especially the unconditional love of God for us as shown in his Son.

On this Sunday the third candle on the Advent wreath is rosecoloured to remind us of the joyful approach of Christmas. In some parishes, the vestments on this day are rose instead of the usual Advent colour of violet (or blue in some churches). "Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, Rejoice!"
