ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT 2023

Our annual Lenten journey begins on Ash Wednesday which this year is the 22nd February. With Christians around the world, following the example of Our Lord, we go into the wilderness. The wilderness is a place of clarification, of stripping down to the essentials, of focusing our lives on God. Jesus was in the tradition of holy people who spent time in the loneliness and harshness of the desert – Moses, Elijah, John the Baptist – where they were able to focus on God without material comforts and other distractions, in order to pray and spend time with God.

Various practices assist us in doing this: studying and meditating on the scriptures, prayer, fasting and abstinence, giving to the poor and needy, being more dedicated in receiving the sacraments, especially reconciliation and the Eucharist, as we seek to live out and renew our baptismal calling to daily die to sin and be raised to new life in Christ. It is a chance to clear away some of the clutter in our lives: mental, physical, and spiritual.

ASH WEDNESDAY LITURGIES

As we have done the last few years, three liturgies will be celebrated on **Ash Wednesday 22nd February**, this year. The Eucharist is celebrated and includes the Imposition of Ashes as a reminder of our mortality. We also pray a special penitential litany and receive God's forgiveness once again. The times will be **8.30am** in the Chapel, **12 midday** in the Church, and **5.00pm** in the Chapel.

The ashes used on Ash Wednesday are made by burning the palm crosses from last year's Palm Sunday liturgies. Could you please bring those palm crosses with you to church next Sunday if you haven't already, and place them in the plate marked at the door to the church.

LENTEN STUDIES

There will be two groups meeting to use the Lenten study booklets, which have been written by the Rt Rev'd Bill Ray, former Bishop of North Queensland, who prepared the Lenten studies a couple of years ago. They are called, *Lord, I'm serious this Lent.* The groups will meet on **Thursdays** at **7.30pm** and **Fridays** at **11.30am** after the 10.30am Eucharist. The groups will commence on **Thursday 23rd February** and **Friday 24th February**. The study books cost \$10.95. For those attending a study group, please pay cash on the first day of the study. If you plan to join a study group, please indicate on the sign-up sheet as you leave the services this morning. For those purchasing the study book only, but not attending a group, please place your money in an envelope with your name "Lenten study book" on the envelope and place it in the offertory plate.

A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 3 verses 10 – 17

Each builder must choose with care how to build on it. 11 For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ. 12 Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw— 13 the work of each builder will become visible, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each has done. 14 If what has been built on the foundation survives, the builder will receive a reward. 15 If the work is burned, the builder will suffer loss; the builder will be saved, but only as through fire. 16 Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? 17 If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew Chapter 5, verses 38 – 48

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

You have heard that it was said, "An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth." ³⁹ But I say to you, Do not resist an evildoer. But if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also; ⁴⁰ and if anyone wants to sue you and take your coat, give your cloak as well; ⁴¹ and if anyone forces you to go one mile, go also the second mile. ⁴² Give to everyone who begs from you, and do not refuse anyone who wants to borrow from you. ⁴³ 'You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your

neighbour and hate your enemy." ⁴⁴ But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax-collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? ⁴⁸ Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

ATTENTION ALL VOLUNTEERS

NATIONALLY CO-ORDINATED CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECK AND SAFE MINISTRY TRAINING IS OVERDUE

I cannot express how urgent it is that <u>ALL</u> Volunteers and Employees under the Anglican Diocese of Newcastle undertake a Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check and do the Safe Ministry training. This was supposed to be completed prior to 15th December, 2022. If you serve <u>in any capacity</u> at the church, this means you. If you haven't already, please:

1. Visit the Diocese's Online Self-Service Portal:

crimcheck.org.au/check/newcastleanglican

and complete an application for a Criminal History Check. (Using this link means the Diocese will pay for it.)

- 2. CrimCheck will then review the application and verify the applicant's identity before submitting the application for processing on behalf of the Diocese and the applicant.
- 3. The applicant and the Diocesan Office will be notified of the results and will receive a final Criminal History Check Certificate which will need to be forwarded to our office (by you) at admin@terrigalanglican.org.au

Please note: This process requires you to upload identity documents during the Crim Check application and take a photo of yourself during the process. Please read the information carefully about the ID you need to provide and have it uploaded to your computer/device prior to attempting the crim check as there is a 30-minute limit once you start. If you require help with this process, please let me know by telephone on 4365 1115 between 10am – 2pm Tuesday or Thursday or email admin@terrigalanglican.org.au

As the training for Safe Ministry training has changed, ALL clergy, staff and volunteers are required to complete the new training.

This training is now only online and is free. Here is the link:

If you need to search for the course name, it is called: OCG - Child Safe - Keeping children safe in organisation e-Learning modules.

Volunteers need to complete the first 9 modules and Clergy need to complete all 11 modules.

Once you have completed the training, please either email the letter of completion or bring a hard copy into the office so that I can update your record with the new date of completion. Ordinary Sunday 7 [Epiphany 7] – Sunday 19 February 2023

• Leviticus 19.1-2, 9-18; Psalm 119.33-40; 1 Corinthians 3.10-17; Matthew 5.38-48

Sometimes, as Christians, we are asked to do what seems to be impossible. At least, what is impossible at first glance. Today, Jesus appears to do just that when at the end of our Gospel reading, He says - 'be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect'. Fortunately, the other readings for today, give us some context about being perfect as God is perfect and that context the impossible becomes possible. Leviticus urges us to be holy as God is holy by opening space for the poor and the alien. In Corinthians we are urged to build our lives on the foundation that is Christ and making our life work consistent with that foundation. The Gospel goes on to urge us to recognise that none are to be hated for who they are - for God makes his sun rise on the evil and the good. Being perfect doesn't mean every action and thought is fully heavenly and pure. Rather, in being willing to love our neighbours as God loves them, we take on the perfection that is our heavenly **Father**

- Pray that we will recognise the face of Christ in those who irk us the most.
- Pray that we will incline ourselves to God's commands to give rather than seek personal gain.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Church of the Church of Pakistan.
