A Reading from the Book of Jonah - Chapter 3, verses 1 to 10

³The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, ²‘Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.’

³So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days’ walk across. ⁴Jonah began to go into the city, going a day’s walk. And he cried out, ‘Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!’ ⁵And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

⁶When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes.

⁷Then he had a proclamation made in Nineveh: ‘By the decree of the king and his nobles: No human being or animal, no herd or flock, shall taste anything. They shall not feed, nor shall they drink water. ⁸Human beings and animals shall be covered with sackcloth, and they shall cry mightily to God. All shall turn from their evil ways and from the violence that is in their hands. ⁹Who knows? God may relent and change his mind; he may turn from his fierce anger, so that we do not perish.’

¹⁰When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Hymn of the Week – 313

Dr Neale published this hymn in his *Carols for Christmas-tide* in 1853. It also appeared in his *Collected Hymns* of 1914. It is a free version of the old German macaronic carol *In dulci jubilo* first found (words & music) in a manuscript of c1400 at the University of Leipzig. The carol is mentioned by a 14th century writer who says that the words were sung by angelic youths who came to Heinrich Suso (d1366, the mystic) to cheer his suffering. The words and tune (*In dulci jubilo*) have appeared in many hymnals over time and have become enormously popular. The great German composer, Johann Sebastian Bach wrote two famous chorale preludes for organ on this tune.
