Reading from the Book of Job Chapter 42, verse 1-6, 10-17

Then Job answered the LORD:

'I know that you can do all things,
and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted.

"Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?"
Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand,
things too wonderful for me, which I did not know.

"Hear, and I will speak;
I will question you, and you declare to me."
I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear,
but now my eye sees you;
therefore I despise myself,
and repent in dust and ashes.'

And the LORD restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before. Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and they ate bread with him in his house; they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the LORD had brought upon him; and each of them gave him a piece of money and a gold ring. The LORD blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand donkeys. He also had seven sons and three daughters. He named the first Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the third Keren-happuch. In all the land there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them an inheritance along with their brothers. After this Job lived for one hundred and forty years, and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations. And Job died, old and full of days.

Psalm 34. Verses 1-8,

I will bless the Lord continually: his praise shall be always in my mouth. Let my soul boast of the Lord: the humble shall hear it and rejoice.

O praise the Lord with me: let us exalt his name together.

For I sought the Lord's help and he answered: and he freed me from all my fears.

Look towards him and be bright with joy: your faces shall not be ashamed.

Here is a wretch who cried, and the Lord heard me: and saved me from all my troubles.

The angel of the Lord encamps round those who fear him: and delivers them in their need.

O taste and see that the Lord is good: happy are they that hide in him!

A Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews Chapter 7, verses 21-28;

but this one became a priest with an oath, because of the one who said to him,

'The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind,

"You are a priest for ever" '—

accordingly Jesus has also become the guarantee of a better covenant.

Furthermore, the former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

And they called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart; get up, he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. Then Jesus said to him, 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man said to him, 'My teacher, let me see

again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has made you well.' Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.

Fr. Roy writes:

We have experienced three weeks of Daylight Saving Time this time around. This is one of those things that we either enjoy or hate. I enjoy it because it gives me time to be outside in the garden after finishing the day in chaplaincy at the university campus at Ourimbah. This applies to each day except Wednesday. This is the day I drive from Ourimbah to Holy Trinity in the daylight for the group that meets each Wednesday for Sacred Reading or Lectio Divina. It means, also, that I drive home in the daylight because the group meets each Wednesday at 5.30pm for an hour. Most people can be home by 7.00pm and it is still daylight.

What is sacred Reading?

In our Sacred Reading we read, prayerfully and slowly the Gospel for the following Sunday and ask God to direct our thinking and actions in relation to the Gospel. In this way each person opens her/himself to God and to what God is saying to the individual through the Gospel. The Gospel passage is read aloud three times. A different question is considered after each reading, followed by times of silence enabling each person to be open to God and to what God is saying to each person. It is a good preparation for worship on the following Sunday. It is an excellent stimulus to our spiritual life.

This is my invitation for you to join this group as often as you are able to attend. All are welcome. I look forward to have you join us on Wednesday at 5.30pm.
