A Reading from the Second Book of Samuel Chapter 5, verse 1 to 5 and 9 to 10

Then all the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron, and said, 'Look, we are your bone and flesh. For some time, while Saul was king over us, it was you who led out Israel and brought it in. The LORD said to you: It is you who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you who shall be ruler over Israel.'

A Reading from St. Paul's second letter to the Church in Corinth Chapter 12, verses 2 to 10.

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows— was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat.

On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations.

Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given to me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.'

So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Mark, Chapter 6, verses 1-13

He left that place and came to his home town, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, 'Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him.

Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief.

Then he went about among the villages teaching. He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.' So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

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Sermon Notes Mark 5.21-43

This Markan material, conspicuously set in Jewish territory, contains the miracle of the healing of the woman with the haemorrhages encircled by the miracle of healing of Jairus's daughter.

As we seek to discern the teachings inherent in these Scriptures it is instructive to note that Jairus is identified as one of the leaders of the synagogue. Further, Mark informs the reader that this Jairus was intentional in seeking out Jesus and "when [Jairus] saw him, fell at [Jesus'] feet and begged him repeatedly". In imploring Jesus to come to his daughter, Jairus expressed absolute confidence that the laying of hands by Jesus would effect healing. And it is also instructive that Jesus immediately responded to Jairus's pleading and went with him.

Just as Jairus's public, and therefore risk-taking and most intentional behaviour towards Jesus manifested great trust, openness and faith in Jesus, so too did the deliberate actions of the woman with the haemorrhages. The evidence which Mark supplies points to a woman of conspicuous means and tenacity who has, for years, been inflicted with a shameful condition which has meant she has been regarded as ritually unclean and, thus, alienated and marginalised. This woman has exhausted her resources in a futile endeavour to achieve healing and subsequent reintegration into community. But then she hears of Jesus and is so committed to seeking him out that she senses that all she has to do is to touch his garment. Her faith, for reasons not revealed, is richly returned, for the grace of God in Jesus affirms that she is indeed healed. Jesus says, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

We do not know, exactly and precisely, why Jairus and the woman with the haemorrhages so confidently and assertively came to Jesus. But we do know that come they did - with great opennesss and trust. Bereft of their own resouces they turned to Jesus. Could it be they responded to God's spiritual leadership? Over and against this possibility the 21st Century cynic may suggest that their motives were entirely self-serving and perhaps, in choosing Jesus, they got lucky! However the Markan reader should regard not only these accounts in Chapter 5 but also the Gospel denouement...Christ crucified, resurrected and ascended. Therein God in Christ has transformed our realities, passionately informed by extravagant love and a healing grace that overwhelms all that would destroy us. The glory of God's is humankind fully alive in Christ. The healing miracles are a forestaste of God's new creation in Christ and a call to be truly open to God; to worship God who treasures us passionately. BG
