The Lord is risen; He is risen indeed Alleluia! Alleluia!

<u>Our</u> <u>Parish</u> <u>Identity</u> We are the body of Christ. His Spirit is with us.

> <u>Our Parish Vision</u> We desire to shine as one in Christ that God's will be done.

A Reading from the book of the Book of Acts Chapter 10, verses 34-43.

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

A Reading from 1 Corinthians 15:19-26

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Alleluia. **Alleluia.** Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. **Alleluia.**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke, Chapter 24: verses 1-12.

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.' Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

THE GOOD FRIDAY GIFT

Palestine: Health Clinic in Ramallah

A small health clinic within the Diocese of Jerusalem requires urgent funding for medical equipment.

The clinic, which is located in the Ramallah area of the West Bank, provides early detection of diabetes. Management of diabetes and treatment information are also offered to patients.

The parish hall at St Andrew's Episcopal Church was renovated to allow room for the clinic.

Unfortunately, once the build had been completed, funding ran out before specialised equipment for diagnosing and assessing diabetes could be purchased.

THE EASTER GIFT

Australia: Youth Engagement in remote communities

With alarming youth suicide and self harm rates across remote communities in Northern Australia, it is clear that more needs to be offered to youth to find identity and purpose.

Youth engagement will be a strong focus for the ABM Reconciliation Program in 2016. ABM's Reconciliation Co-ordinator, Mal MacCallum said, "There's a new report put together by 41 elders in top end of Australia and it's about the alarming youth suicide and harm rates that have come into play in the last decade. The statistics say the youth suicide rate is the highest in the world – that's in our own country and that's a frightening thing. It's something we are oblivious to in many respects, in our own sheltered communities and in our Christian communities too."

The focus will be in the remote communities of North Queensland, Torres Strait Islands and the Northern Territory. The initiatives will be implemented through consultation with local churches, NATSIAC and the dioceses.

With your support we can ensure young people are engaged in their community and supported in their needs.
