### Exploring the Exile

These reflections have been written by The Reverend Glenn Loughr, he is a Wiradjuri man with a particular interest in the topic of exile and in the work of Thomas Merton, Dorothy Day, Czeslaw Milosz, Gustavo Guitierrez and others who have explored the experience of exile as a means to transform injustice. The resources are available to download through the ABM website.

There are five reflections, with poetry and art, prayer suggestions, and it encourages you to engage in discussion, or write a reconciliation journal as you prayerfully participate and reflect.

### As Australians, we are all here, woven into this country. As part of our reconciliation journey, there are truths to tell, stories to celebrate, and relationships to grow. Reconciliation is at the heart of our nation's future.

This coming week, a very significant time, as May 27th, marks the anniversary of the 1967 referendum, Australia's most successful referendum and a defining event in our nation's history, when over 90 per cent of Australians voted to give the Commonwealth the power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and recognise them in the national census. The following week on the 3rd June, Commemorates the High Court of Australia's landmark Mabo decision in 1992.
