And the LORD your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all your undertakings, in the fruit of your body, in the fruit of your livestock, and in the fruit of your soil. For the LORD will again take delight in prospering you, just as he delighted in prospering your ancestors, when you obey the LORD your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law, because you turn to the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke, Chapter 10; verses 25-37

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.'

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Mission Report 10th July 2016

SEA SUNDAY

Lord God, Creator of land and sea, bless those who work at sea. Be with them in fair weather and storms, in danger and distress. Strengthen them when weary, lift them up when down and comfort them when lonely and far from their loved ones. Bring them safely to shore Lord God and bless those who are there to welcome them. In Jesus name. Amen.

On Sea Sunday 10 July, Dioceses / parishes throughout Australia, including those in-land that do not have a commercial seaport, are encouraged to support the Mission to Seafarers, as all of Australia benefits from the labours of seafarers, through the use and enjoyment of goods imported.

With almost 90 per cent of trade being transported by sea, the maritime industry plays a vital role in the world economy. Amongst other services, the Mission looks after Seafarers who are abandoned in port and those who are sick or injured through accidents.

Some of the modern challenges facing Seafarers and this industry include: piracy and its impact on Seafarers and their families, workplace accidents, the changing face of the international shipping industry, smaller crews due to mechanisation and other developments, shortening turnaround times for container ships, and workers being increasingly recruited from developing countries where wages are low

Sea Sunday acknowledges the vital role of the thousands of Seafarers who transit through Australia's 25 ports while working at sea, and also the dedicated port chaplains, and volunteers who give witness to their faith in working with this ministry.

The Mission to Seafarers at the Port of Newcastle relies on the generosity of parish support through the Sea Sunday appeal. Parishioners are also asked to keep seafarers and their families in their prayers.

Thank you to all who have worked to assist this year's Sea Sunday appeal, through the donations of warm clothing from the Op-shop, magazines, monetary gift, and of course our knitters; the many parishioners, the ecumenical members of the Whispers with Love, our extended families and friends....all who have with love and care, spent hours of their time, knitting beanies for the seafarers. These beanies are greatly appreciated by the seafarers who visit the Port of Newcastle. It has truly been a very huge effort by everyone.

FROM THE RECTOR

"<u>A ROYAL WASTE OF TIME</u>"

I found this little reflection about worship very helpful and you may too.

"Worship is a waste of time. That is the first thing that must be asserted in any useful discussion of the Christian custom of gathering regularly to praise the God of heaven and earth. For the praise of God is what worship is all about. Like the ethos of Sabbath at its roots, worship is not primarily about productive work. Worship is distorted and even perverted if it is made instrumental, the means to some other end than glorifying and honoring God. Today we can hear a growing chorus of voices saying that regular worship and clean Christian living makes people happier, healthier, and – some would add – wealthier. But if people undertake worship in order to become happy and healthy, they are using God as a means to their own ends. Yet, if worship does not show us that the God met in Israel and Jesus Christ is not a god to be used, what does it show Instrumentalized worship is debased worship, worship reduced to us? psychological therapy or political consciousness-raising. True and right worship (literally orthodoxy) is first and foremost the service of God and needs no further justification."

ARTICLES FOR THE PEW BULLETIN

A number of people have asked me about the preparation of the pew bulletin. I usually prepare it each week from home on my computer by changing readings, dates and forward planning as much as possible. It is then emailed to the office on Wednesday morning and further items which have been left or emailed into the office, prayer list etc are then included/updated. This often means juggling the articles which are already in the pew bulletin to make things fit. Readings are checked against those which have been pre printed to make sure there are no errors and then the pew bulletin is forwarded to members of our clergy and parish council who are asked to read it and check for errors.

Any further errors are then emailed to me at home and I make corrections. Once we have it to a final draft it is emailed to Fr. Mark for his approval or for any further corrections or late notices. We are now at the stage of printing, so once again it is emailed to the office and Kyara Newport prints the pew bulletin off on Friday mornings.

As you can see there is quite a large volume of work by many people which goes into printing our pew bulletin each week. Our wonderful copier helps so much with the printing but we are restricted to having our copy in multiples of 4 for our pages, which means we work on 8, 12 or 16 A4 pages to print to the booklet you get each week. The original copy has a large font, so when printed it is readable in the booklet.

You would therefore appreciate my requests in the past to have all copy into me by Wednesday morning. I am quite happy to juggle the items in the pew bulletin as much as possible but usually by Wednesday lunch time we have filled the pages to capacity. If you have items for the bulletin please let me know in advance if you are dropping things into the office by ringing me or sending an email. I can then leave space for your article and make sure it is accommodated.
