### A reading from Philippians Chapter 3, verses 3 – 14

For it is we who are the circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and boast in Christ Jesus and have no confidence in the flesh— even though I, too, have reason for confidence in the flesh.

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on towards the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

#### Holy Week and Easter

We are about to enter one of the great seasons of the Christian Church's year. Appropriately, our liturgical disciplines begin with the Palm Sunday liturgy, as our Lord Jesus the Christ enters Jerusalem to a tumultuous welcome from the crowds.

Most significantly this tumultuous welcome is based up the crowd's flawed and self-serving expectations of Jesus. Within days a Jerusalem crowd will be baying for the death of Jesus. To a most reluctant Pontius Pilate they shouted of Jesus... 'Away with him!', 'Crucify him!.

And the crowd had well and truly dispersed, when, on the still morning of Easter Day, Mary Magdalene rushed to announce to the disciples... "I have seen the Lord!" [John 20.18]

In the words of the young man in the tomb of Jesus, 'dressed in white a robes and sitting on the right'...''Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified.

He has been raised: he is not here." [Mark 16.6]

Our liturgical pattern, which is designed to facilitate our shared journey from Palm Sunday to Easter Day, features the following:

**Palm Sunday** – We share the **Liturgy of the Palms**, based upon the Gospel account of the 'triumphal entry of Jesus' into Jerusalem. This is followed by the **Liturgy of the Passion**, including a full reading of Mark's account of the passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. Thus, our journey begins in the full knowledge of God's extravagant Easter gift.

**Maundy Thursday** – We revisit the Gospel account of the night before the passion of our Lord. Notably this account includes **the washing of the feet** of the disciples by Jesus, a turn of events which flawed the disciples. Then follows the last supper, when Jesus institutes **Holy Eucharist** and commands us to participate in all that this sacrament is and means. And then there is betrayal, Gethsemane and waiting.

To embrace the momentous events of Good Friday Eve we share in a **foot washing**; we share in **Holy Eucharist**; we **empty the sanctuary** to give effect to a visual starkness and desolation resonate of the realities of Good Friday, Then, in the quiet of the night, we share a **vigil**, for as long as the Spirit moves each individual.

**Good Friday** –It is not universally agreed, but this day may be called 'good' for we remember when God in Christ transformed our destiny and the very meaning of our lives. We acknowledge that this is fulfilled in the gift of the unconditional love, selfless sacrifice and costly vulnerability of Jesus. Good Friday worship marks this stunning God moment, as we focus upon the Scriptural accounts, behold a symbol of Christ's cross and prayerfully kneel before God **in penitence and faith.** 

**Easter Eve** – As we await the great Feast of Easter parishioners are asked to be a part of preparing our worship space – if you will, spring cleaning on the Saturday morning before the coming of the light. Details of this time of preparation appear elsewhere in this bulletin.

In the times of Jesus, and under Jewish rhythms, the new day begins upon the setting of the sun. Accordingly, on Easter Eve we shall share an highly symbolic service which begins with the lighting of the new fire in the grounds of Holy Trinity. The new Paschal candle is lit and then, following immediately, each parishioner's personal candle.

We follow the Paschal candle into the darkened church. As the candles begin to spread light we hear a series of Scripture readings which rehearse God's salvation history. The climax is, of course, the gift of resurrection in Jesus Christ our Lord, whereupon the lights of the church are turned on and we sing the **Gloria in excelsis**. This is followed by the renewal of Baptismal Vows and Holy Eucharist – the two great dominical sacraments have meaning and effect because Christ is risen, he lives and he is the vivifying Spirit of sacrament!

**Easter Day** – **Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!** After 40 days and 40 nights of waiting, under the disciplines of Lent, this is a day of great rejoicing and exaltation. The Services of Holy Eucharist on Easter Day are exactly in the pattern which we then share on every Sunday throughout the rest of the church's year. We celebrate Christ's glorious resurrection!!! Alleluia! (*The Reverend Canon*) Brian Gibbs
