A reading from Ecclesiastes Chapter 1, verses 2, 12 – 14 Chapter 2, verses 18 – 23

Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

I, the Teacher, when king over Israel in Jerusalem, applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to human beings to be busy with. I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun; and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to those who come after me —and who knows whether they will be wise or foolish? Yet they will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. So I turned and gave my heart up to despair concerning all the toil of my labours under the sun, because sometimes one who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave all to be enjoyed by another who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. What do mortals get from all the toil and strain with which they toil under the sun? For all their days are full of pain, and their work is a vexation; even at night their minds do not rest. This also is vanity.

Hear the word of the Lord Thanks be to God

Psalm 49, verses 1 – 12

O hear this, all you peoples: give ear, all you inhabitants of the world,

All children of earth, offspring of Adam: both rich and poor alike.

For my mouth shall speak wisdom: and the thoughts of my heart shall be full of understanding.

I will incline my ear to a riddle: and unfold the mystery to the sounds of the harp.

Why should I fear in the evil days: when the wickedness of my deceivers surrounds me,

Though they trust to their great wealth: and boast of the abundance of their riches?

No one may ransom another: or give God a price for them,

So that they may live for ever: and never see the grave;

For to ransom a life is so costly: that it must be abandoned for ever.

For we see that the wise die: and perish with the foolish and the ignorant, leaving their wealth to others.

The tomb is their home for ever, their dwelling-place throughout all generations: though they called estates after their own names.

The rich without understanding: are like the beasts that perish.

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Colossians chapter 3, verses 1 – 11

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Prayer for the week

Almighty God, whose beloved Son for our sake willingly endured the agony and shame of the cross: give us courage and patience to take up our cross daily and follow him; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

MONEY, MONEY, MONEY

Jesus says in today's Gospel: "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions" (Luke 12:15). When the subject of money is raised in the Church, there is a nervous shifting in the seat and a lowering of the eyes as though something uncomfortable or unseemly is being brought up for discussion. We think church is all about 'spiritual' matters (whatever that means) so any talk of earthly and material things like money or sex is regarded as taboo. In an individualistic society like ours, there is also a widespread belief that money is *mine* to do with as I please. After all, I earned it so I suppose I can do what I like with it.

Discussing the subject in a church context also gives people a faint impression that the Church has an ulterior motive – "they want your money." We should never be coy about money and challenging people regarding stewardship for the simple reason that the Bible and Jesus himself have plenty to say on the subject. Years ago I heard Dr Han Kyung Chik speaking on stewardship. He was the Pastor of Young Nak Church in Seoul, South Korea, the largest Presbyterian Church in the world. He pointed out that **Jesus spoke five times as much about material things as he did any other subject**. He mentioned it 91 times in Matthew, 57 times in Mark, 94 times in Luke and 88 times in John. In fact, one out of every six verses in the Gospels refers to the right and wrong use of material possessions. I haven't done the maths, but I would suggest that if Jesus taught more about money and our use of material

possessions than any other subject, it would only seem reasonable for us to give the same serious attention to it.

Money is not good or bad in itself. Many commodities in life are neutral, but they can be *used* for good or evil purposes. For example, a knife is a neutral object that can be used to stab someone or be used to slice bread. Money can be used to benefit and help people, or it can be used selfishly. A verse in the Bible that's often misquoted as "money is the root of all evil" actually says, "For the *love* of money is a root of all kinds of evil" (1 Tim. 6:10 emphasis mine). Money as a means of exchange is neutral and can be used for good or evil.

Jesus said some pretty unequivocal things about money which go against the general consensus in our society, especially one in which economics and finance receive so much attention and dominate political discourse as well as our lives.

Jesus said, "Freely you have received, freely give" (Matthew 10:8). Our stewardship is ultimately an expression of our gratitude. When we reflect on the goodness of God and the abundant provision of God in our lives, we are moved to praise and thanksgiving. This will be expressed in our singing, our witnessing, in showing hospitality (especially to the stranger) and in the giving of our money.
