Presiding and Preaching - Fr Roy Hazlewood Organist – Chris Sillince **Fr. Roy writes:** This is very different to my usual writing. I am writing about Maureen and myself. Some of you know that I was on my own last Sunday because Maureen was in hospital. She was taken by ambulance on the Thursday prior to Sunday. I was booked already for a surgical procedure last Monday with the expectation of an overnight stay. Maureen showed signs of considerable progress by the time I saw her on Sunday evening. She had received Holy Communion with a Host from the morning's Eucharist. You can see how we were all connected in the Body of Christ. On Monday, my surgery was successfully completed, and I spent the night in hospital, hoping to return home on Tuesday. So here we are together at home. I am all right and Maureen said that she has improved but is nothing like the way she was the last time you saw her. She looks forward to continued improvement We do not know a diagnosis of the cause of the situation.

My reason for writing in this way is first, to express my thanks to God the Great Healer for the healing we have received. Secondly, for your prayers and concern for our wellness, thirdly, thanks to those of the parish who have transported me around my duties presiding in the Eucharist while Fr. Mark takes a holiday. I feel very privileged to be able to minister to you in this way. Lastly, my thanks to God for my call to the priesthood and the privilege of ministering in this section of the Body of Christ on earth.

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, 'There is peace and security', then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labour pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then, let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night.

But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

His master said to him, "Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master." Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, "Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours." But his master replied, "You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

The Seafarer Christmas Drive – Will you help us deliver hope this Christmas?

We are currently taking donations towards Christmas packs for seafarers.

Christmas is usually a difficult time for seafarers, and this year seafarers are going to feel the separation from their families even more acutely.

Last year, with your help, we managed to supply 850 packs to seafarers far from home. However, this year, we hope to reach 1,000 seafarers!

Thank you to everyone who contributed to this years' Sea Sunday appeal. All the donations will be given to the mission for the Seafarer Christmas Appeal.

The tally of beanies as of last Sunday was **236**. There was a wonderful mixture of colors, textures, patterns, cables, colour work (fair isle), knitted and crocheted.
