Fr. Roy writes: We are still in the Church's season of Easter and two questions come to my mind. The first, "How did my spiritual life with Christ grow during my Lenten discipline as a disciple of Christ?" During this time of Easter when we think of New Life in Christ through his death and resurrection, it is good to reflect on our spiritual growth and of our experiences of and with the living Jesus during Lent.

Secondly, "How am I going to bring my experiences of Christ in God into my gossiping the Gospel?" This is important for every Christian to place Christ before the people within our circle of relations, friends, colleagues and acquaintances to share the Gospel with them. Continue to pray daily for five people who you know but do not really know God in Jesus.

We believe that the message of Easter is about light in the midst of darkness, hope in the midst of despair, love in the midst of hatred and violence, and New Life in Christ Jesus who is alive and loves us as we walk with Him in our daily lives. It is us along with other Christians who are the Body of Christ in this area and who show Christ the Light of the world to the other people of our society.

To-day is, also, Anzac Day, a day when we acknowledge the sacrifice and the loyalty of troops in 1915 and Australian and New Zealand military service personnel in other conflicts since that time. We thank them for these attributes and pray for their safety in the coming years. Sacrifice and loyalty are important for Christians, soldiers of Christ, in the battle against evil in the world. Our weapons, however, are different. They are love, hope, light and New Life in Christ Jesus. We use them in our daily life and pray constantly that God may cast out the snares of the enemy and bring all people into the Light of Christ in the Resurrection.

Each of us is a unique person, created by God in our mother's womb and living to fulfil our vocation in the world as a Christian. Here are two quotes from Scriptures for you to use in your prayers daily.

The psalmist writes in Psalm 139 verse 14: **"I am fearfully and wonderfully made."** And St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15 verse 10: **"By the grace of God, I am what I am".**

Keep well, keep safe and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and may your days and nights be holy, good and peaceful. AMEN.

The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Chapter 10 verses 11 to 18

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'
