FR ROY WRITES: The Lambeth Conference 2022 of bishops from throughout the Anglican Communion has concluded and the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby gave a short summary of outcomes from his point of view. Some of that which I write is not a direct quotation of his words: it is more my summary of his summary and to apply it to ourselves, while other parts are a quotation from his preaching at the final Eucharist of the conference. I trust that this makes sense to you.

The first thing that gained my attention was that among such a diverse group of women and men, all bishops of the Anglican Communion, from different countries, different cultures and languages and different interpretations of Scriptures, the way that the Love of Christ grew within them for themselves and one another during their time together in prayer, in worship, in learning in small groups and larger ones, in social conversations and in times of solitude.

This, of course, does not apply only to bishops attending a Lambeth Conference, but to every parish and congregation throughout the world. In the words of Scripture "See how these Christians love one another." This was used in a derogatory way when it was first used, and it can be used in the same way to-day where the world is so self-centred with an attitude of "every person for themselves and don't care about the others." I do not believe, however, that this is 100 per cent true of everyone who is not a Christian. I witness daily acts of human kindness to others who are unknown to us and who need our help.

The archbishop, also, reflected upon the difference that periods of solitude made to the lives of participants during the conference. This practice, used daily, is important for you and me to have some time quietly in the conscious Presence of God and to be open to what God will make known to us.

As we continue to know and experience God's love for us and for all God's people we are thrown back to our mission in the world. We, as individual committed Christians, and the Church as a whole, are called back to the Five Marks of Mission – Tell, Teach, Tend, Transform and Treasure.

TELL- To know the Gospel and to be able to tell it to other people and be able to say something about their own testimony of their love and meeting with Jesus Christ, Welby said. "They may not be eloquent, their theology may be slightly crude, but when they speak from the heart, others listen," and their transformed lives and their ways of worship illustrate their words.

TEACH – This is our responsibility to provide resources for the formation of the life and faith, and belief of the new Christian. TEND – This is the pastoral care of that person during the ups and downs of their Christian life and to respond to human need with loving kindness to the best of one's ability.

TRANSFORM – This is the transforming of life with Christian ethics and virtues to be walking more and more in the way of Jesus. This applies, also, to the ills of society, seeking justice and peace, and reconciliation among people and nations.

TREASURE – This is a Christian treasure to the world, called to be a saint who lives in a way with Jesus in love and humility in eternal life on earth as in heaven. This treasure includes striving to safeguard the integrity of Creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth.

It is essential that we, as a parish and church within the Anglican Communion, that each of us understands that we are to be witnesses to the Gospel and the Christian way of life because we are baptised and filled with the Holy Spirit. We belong to the Church of the living God who brings us to hope of life eternal.

Keep well, keep safe, keep social distancing, continue to wear a face mask and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and pray for and may your days and nights be holy, good, and peaceful. **AMEN**

A Reading from the Letter of the Hebrews Chapter 12, verses 18 – 29.

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, 'If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death.' Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, 'I tremble with fear.') But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, 'Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven.' This phrase 'Yet once more' indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me.

The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 13, verses 10 – 17.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Now he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, 'Woman, you are set free from your ailment.' When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, 'There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day.' But the Lord answered him and said, 'You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?' When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.

Last Friday Richard and I visited the Mission to Seafarers in Newcastle. We took with us over 350 beanies, 30 pairs of socks, a box of toiletries and 4 boxes of Bibles that have come through the Op Shop.

We had a tour of the premises and a chat to the manager. The seafarers are gradually coming ashore and visiting the centre. Many of the ships still won't let their crew off the ship as Australia is considered a COVID unsafe port.

The mission is taking Care Bags onto the ships. These contain beanies, socks, toiletries, other clothes and chocolate among other things. They love the chocolates!
