GAUDETE SUNDAY

Today, the Third Sunday of Advent, is sometimes known as Gaudete Sunday. *Gaudete* is the Latin word for "rejoice." The name comes from the introit or entrance hymn in the old liturgy. It comes from St Paul's letter to the Philippians: *Gaudete in Domino semper* or "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Phil. 4:4). The focus of Advent is the coming of Jesus in his incarnation in the womb of his Blessed Mother; his coming to his Church in the Holy Spirit made present to us by faith and repentance, the ministry of word, prayer and sacrament; and his final Advent at the end of time.

The late Dutch priest and writer, Henri Nouwen, said there is a difference between joy and happiness: happiness depends on external circumstances, our health, our wealth, our relationships and so on. Joy is not finally dependant on those externals, but on knowing that God loves us without condition and that even adversity and sickness, stress, injustice, violence and even death itself, can never take it away from us. In his letter to the Romans, Paul says, "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose" (Rm 8:28). It is possible to know joy even in our sadness. This Sunday of joy can remind us not to fret and fuss over all the things we've not yet done to prepare for Christmas, but to think of all the good things we have in life, especially the unconditional love of God for us as shown in his Son.

On this Sunday the third candle on the Advent wreath is rosecoloured to remind us of the joyful approach of Christmas. In some parishes, the vestments on this day are rose instead of the usual Advent colour of violet (or blue in some churches). "Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, Rejoice!"

LIGHTING OF THE THIRD ADVENT CANDLE

THE BLIND SEE AGAIN. Many of the Jewish people did not expect a Messiah like Jesus. Many wondered: 'Are you the one who is to come?' Jesus came not to exercise sovereignty and power over the people but to bring blessing to the poor and needy. Let us celebrate his birth this Christmas by being good news for the poor.

We have lit the candles of *hope* and *peace*. Today we light the candle of *joy*. In today's Epistle St Paul exhorts the Philippians to "rejoice always". The Latin for "rejoice" is *Gaudete*, so the Third Sunday in Advent has been called Gaudete Sunday. We rejoice not because things are always going well, but because the Lord has come, the Lord is coming, and the Lord will come. Knowing that the Lord is near eliminates worry and fear.

Joy is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the joy we find in Jesus Christ.

The third candle is lit.

Thank you God, for the joy you give us. As we await the fulfillment of your promise, keep our joy alive. Help us today and every day, to worship you, to hear your word, and to do your will by sharing your joy with others. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer of the Day

As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written,

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you."

Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

ATTENTION ALL VOLUNTEERS NATIONALLY CO-ORDINATED CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECK AND SAFE MINISTRY TRAINING

<u>ALL</u> Volunteers and Employees of the Anglican Diocese of Newcastle are required to undertake a Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check. We need this completed prior to 15th December, 2022. If you haven't already, to do this:

1. Visit the Diocese's Online Self-Service Portal:

crimcheck.org.au/check/newcastleanglican

and complete an application for a Criminal History Check.

- 2. CrimCheck will then review the application and verify the applicant's identity before submitting the application for processing on behalf of the Diocese and the applicant.
- 3. The applicant and the Diocesan Office will be notified of the results and will receive a final Criminal History Check Certificate.

This process requires you to upload four identity documents to their website. If you require help with this process, please contact me to arrange a date and time for you to come to the office. Our phone number is 4365 1115 and I am available between 10am – 2pm Tuesday or Thursday or email admin@terrigalanglican.org.au

You will need to bring your four items of ID documentation for me to help you such as passport, drivers' licence (or photo ID), Medicare card, pension card and birth certificate.

Also, every three years all clergy, staff and volunteers are required to undergo the Safe Ministry training. This training is now only online and is free. Here is the link:

https://ocg.nsw.gov.au/training-and-resources/elearning

If you need to search for the course name, it is called:

OCG – Child Safe – Keeping children safe in organisation e-Learning modules.

Volunteers need to complete the first 9 modules and Clergy need to complete all 11 modules.

As the training has changed, regardless of your last training date, all clergy, staff and volunteers are required to complete the new training.

Once you have completed the training, please either email the letter of completion or bring a hard copy into the office so that I can update your record with the new date of completion.
