

Prayer of the Day

O God,
in a wonderful sacrament
you have given us a memorial of the passion of your dear Son;
grant that we may so reverence
the sacred mysteries of his body and blood
that we may ever know within ourselves
the fruits of his redemption;
who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A reading from Exodus Chapter 24 verses 3 – 8

3 Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD and all the ordinances; and all the people answered with one voice, and said, 'All the words that the LORD has spoken we will do.' ⁴And Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD. He rose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and set up twelve pillars, corresponding to the twelve tribes of Israel. ⁵He sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt-offerings and sacrificed oxen as offerings of well-being to the LORD. ⁶Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he dashed against the altar. ⁷Then he took the book of the covenant, and read it in the hearing of the people; and they said, 'All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient.' ⁸Moses took the blood and dashed

it on the people, and said, 'See the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words.'

3 The cords of death encompassed me,

'O Lord, I beseech you, deliver me !'**

5 Gracious and righteous is the Lord:
full of compassion is our God.

**6 The Lord preserves the simple:
when I was brought low, he saved me.**

7 Return, O my soul, to your rest:
for the Lord has rewarded you.

**8 For you, O Lord, have delivered my soul from death:
my eyes from tears and my feet from falling.**

9 I will walk before the Lord:
in the land of the living.

**10 I believed that I would perish, I was brought very low:
I said in my haste 'Everyone is a liar.'**

11 How shall I repay the Lord:
for all his benefits to me?

**12 I will take up the cup of salvation:
and call upon the name of the Lord.**

13 I will pay my vows to the Lord:
in the presence of all his people.

**14 Grievous in the sight of the Lord:
is the death of his faithful ones.**

15 O Lord, I am your servant,
your servant and the child of your handmaid:
you have unloosed my bonds.

**16 I will offer you a sacrifice of thanksgiving:
and call upon the name of the Lord.**

17 I will pay my vows to the Lord:
in the presence of all his people,

**18 In the courts of the house of the Lord:
even in your midst, O Jerusalem. Praise the Lord.**

**A reading from The First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians
Chapter 10 verses 14 – 21**

14 Therefore, my dear friends, flee from the worship of idols. ¹⁵I speak as to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say. ¹⁶The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? ¹⁷Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. ¹⁸Consider the people of Israel; are not those who eat the sacrifices partners in the altar? ¹⁹What do I imply then? That food sacrificed to idols is anything, or that an idol is anything? ²⁰No, I imply that what pagans sacrifice, they sacrifice to demons and not to God. I do not want you to be partners with demons. ²¹You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. You cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons.

Hear the word of the Lord.
Thanks be to God.

Alleluia, **alleluia!**

I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord;
whoever eats this bread will live for ever.

Alleluia!

**The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark
Chapter 14 verses 12 – 26**

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

12 On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' ¹³So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them,

'Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, ¹⁴and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" ¹⁵He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there.' ¹⁶So the disciples set out and went to the city, and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

¹⁷ When it was evening, he came with the twelve. ¹⁸And when they had taken their places and were eating, Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me.' ¹⁹They began to be distressed and to say to him one after another, 'Surely, not I?' ²⁰He said to them, 'It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the bowl with me. ²¹For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that one by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that one not to have been born.'

²² While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body.' ²³Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. ²⁴He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. ²⁵Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.'

²⁶ When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

Ninety per cent of the world's goods are carried by sea. Without seafarers our economy would grind to a halt. Many of the seafarers that come into our ports have little personal comforts or warm clothing as many of them are from hotter climates in Asian countries.

Many seafarers send all their wages home to their families, often allowing them to seek medical care and schooling for their children. They love our beanies, socks and toiletries. We also send them Bibles which are available for them to use at the Centre and take if they wish.

- Exodus 24.3-8; Psalm 116; 1 Corinthians 10.14-21; Mark 14.12-16 (17-21) 22-26

Mark tells us how Jesus provided perfect answers to the
disciples' questions. They did what he told them and
consequently, shared the Passover together.

We too have only to ask. "This is the confidence we have in
approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will,
he hears us." 1 John 5.14-15 NIV. The result might not be as
momentous as the breaking of bread (his body) and drinking
from the cup (his blood), but it is the same Christ who listens
and answers.
