Prayer of the Day

Undaunted you seek the lost, O God, exultant you bring home the found: touch our hearts with grateful wonder at the tenderness of your forbearing love; grant us delight in the mercy that has found us; and bring all to rejoice at the feast of forgiven sinners. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

A Reading from Exodus Chapter 32, verses 7 – 14

⁷ The Lord said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; 8 they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ' 9 The Lord said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. 10 Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.' 11 But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? 12 Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. 13 Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to

them by your own self, saying to them, "I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it for ever." ' ¹⁴ And the Lord changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

- ¹ Have mercy on me, O God, in your enduring goodness: according to the fulness of your compassion blot out my offences.
- ² Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness: and cleanse me from my sin.
- ³ For I acknowledge my rebellion: and my sin is ever before me.
- ⁴ Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your eyes: so you will be just in your sentence and blameless in your judging.
- ⁵ Surely in wickedness I was brought to birth: and in sin my mother conceived me.
- ⁶ You that desire truth in the inward parts:
 O teach me wisdom in the secret places of the heart.

- ⁹ Hide your face from my sins: and blot out all my iniquities.
- ¹⁰ Create in me a clean heart, O God: and renew a right spirit within me.

A Reading from 1 Timothy Chapter 1

¹ Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope, ² To Timothy, my loyal

child in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. 3 I urge you, as I did when I was on my way to Macedonia, to remain in Ephesus so that you may instruct certain people not to teach any different doctrine, 4 and not to occupy themselves with myths and endless genealogies that promote speculations rather than the divine training that is known by faith. 5 But the aim of such instruction is love that comes from a pure heart, a good conscience, and sincere faith. ⁶ Some people have deviated from these and turned to meaningless talk, ⁷ desiring to be teachers of the law, without understanding either what they are saying or the things about which they make assertions. 8 Now we know that the law is good, if one uses it legitimately. 9 This means understanding that the law is laid down not for the innocent but for the lawless and disobedient, for the godless and sinful, for the unholy and profane, for those who kill their father or mother, for murderers, 10 fornicators, sodomites, slave-traders, liars, perjurers, and whatever else is contrary to the sound teaching ¹¹ that conforms to the glorious gospel of the blessed God, which he entrusted to me. 12 I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, ¹³ even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, 14 and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. 15 The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. 16 But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. ¹⁷ To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen. 18 I am giving you these instructions, Timothy, my child, in accordance with the prophecies made earlier about you, so that by following them you may fight the good fight, 19 having faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have suffered shipwreck in the faith; ²⁰ among them are Hymenaeus

and Alexander, whom I have turned over to Satan, so that they may learn not to blaspheme.

¹ Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.' 3 So he told them this parable: 4 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? 5 When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." 7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance. 8 'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? 9 When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." 10 Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'

What was a South African doing on the staff of ABM in the late 1990s? The answer is that in 1994 I wrote an article on Anglicans and mission in GrapeVine, a journal that I founded in 1982 and that, from 1988 and into the 1990s, was published by an ABM-funded media project under the Anglican Church of Southern Africa's Department of Mission, of which I was director. Bishop Brian Kyme, ABM's national director at the time, read the article and wrote to invite me to serve as national mission education officer. I was interviewed in Sydney on my way back home from an Anglican mission consultation in Singapore, and in January 1995 Lorna, John (then 8), David (then 5) and I left Cape Town and moved into the ABM house in Earlwood in Sydney.

Four memorable years followed as I travelled around Australia to address clergy schools and diocesan conferences and lead mission workshops, preached in supportive parishes, edited Partners, launched ABM's journal interMission, and developed resources for the team of regional directors to use in their own work. We returned to South Africa at the end of 1998, as intended when I agreed to join ABM.

We were greatly enriched by our experience of life in Australia, and are deeply grateful to Brian Kyme (who died in 2020) and to ABM for all that they gave us. Several colleagues, such as Tim Gibson and Debra Saffrey-Collins, became good friends with whom I have stayed in contact.

I send my warmest greetings to the ABM family, especially to John Deane, who was development officer when we were both based at 91 Bathurst Street; and I give thanks for ABM's 175 years of witness to and advocacy for the transforming mission of God.
