# A Reading from Jeremiah Chapter 14, verses 7 – 10 and 19 – 22

<sup>7</sup> Although our iniquities testify against us, act, O Lord, for your name's sake; our rebellions indeed are many, and we have sinned against you.

<sup>8</sup> O hope of Israel, its saviour in time of trouble, why should you be like a stranger in the land, like a traveller turning aside for the night?

<sup>9</sup> Why should you be like someone confused, like a mighty warrior who cannot give help? Yet you, O Lord, are in the midst of us,

and we are called by your name; do not forsake us!

10 Thus says the Lord concerning this people: Truly they have loved to wander; they have not restrained their feet; therefore the Lord does not accept them; now he will remember their iniquity and punish their sins.

<sup>19</sup> Have you completely rejected Judah? Does your heart loathe Zion? Why have you struck us down so that there is no healing for us? We look for peace but find no good, for a time of healing, but there is terror instead. <sup>20</sup> We acknowledge our wickedness, O Lord, the iniquity of our ancestors, for we have sinned against you. <sup>21</sup> Do not spurn us, for your name's sake; do not dishonour your glorious throne; remember and do not break your covenant with us <sup>22</sup> Can any idols of the nations bring rain, or can the heavens give showers? Is it not you, O Lord our God? We set our hope on you, for it is you who do all this.

<sup>16</sup> At my first defence no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! <sup>17</sup> But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. <sup>18</sup> The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

## The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 18, verses 15 – 30

### **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

<sup>15</sup> People were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them, and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. <sup>16</sup> But Jesus called for them and said, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. <sup>17</sup> Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it."

<sup>18</sup> A certain ruler asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>19</sup> Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. <sup>20</sup> You know the commandments: "You shall not commit adultery. You shall not murder. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. Honor your father and mother.'" <sup>21</sup> He replied, "I have kept all these since my youth." <sup>22</sup> When Jesus heard this, he said to him, "There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." <sup>23</sup> But when he heard this, he became sad, for he was very rich. <sup>24</sup> Jesus looked at him and said, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! <sup>25</sup> Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."

<sup>26</sup> Those who heard it said, "Then who can be saved?" <sup>27</sup> He replied, "What is impossible for mortals is possible for God."

<sup>28</sup> Then Peter said, "Look, we have left our homes and followed you." <sup>29</sup> And he said to them, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children for the sake of the kingdom of God <sup>30</sup> who will not get back very much more in this age and in the age to come eternal life."
