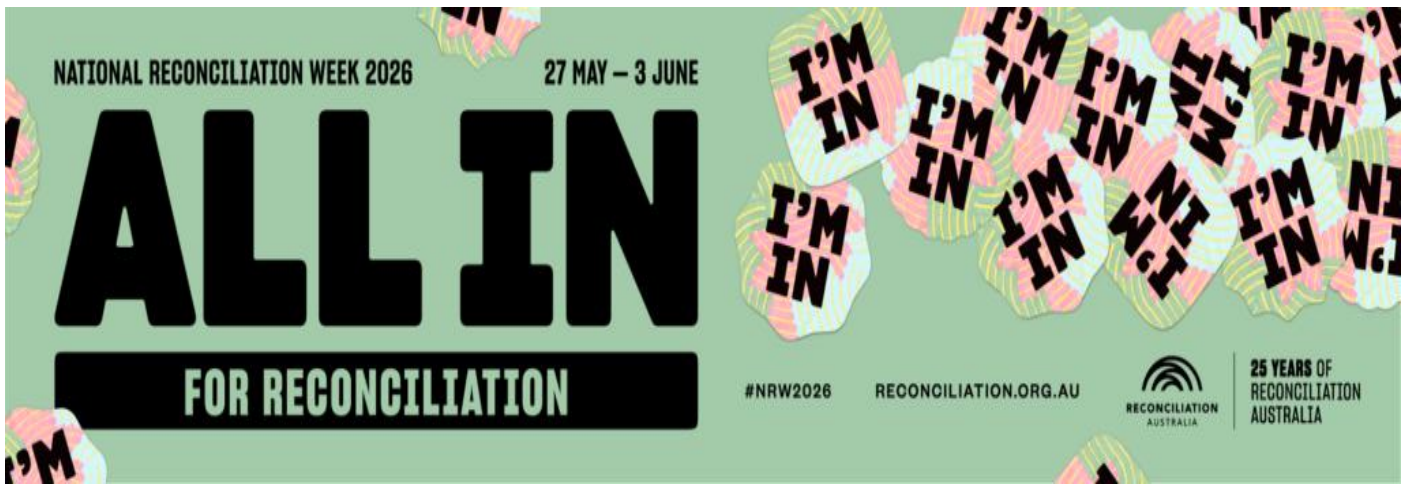
## **WYOMING EMERGENCY RELIEF CENTRE (WERC)**

## **MISSION NEWS**

Our current mission focus is on the Mission to Seafarers. As is our practice, we support the Mission to Seafarers in the Port of Newcastle by knitting beanies and providing toiletries and other comfort items.

The Mission provides support for the physical and spiritual welfare of merchant crews worldwide.

The following information was shared with me recently and comes from Bunbury Mission to Seafarers. Worth thinking about.

'An estimated 50,000 seafarers are stranded in the Straits of Hormuz, caught in a traffic jam of over 1,000 vessels, facing danger of attack and diminishing supplies.

With destination plants unable to run while they are stationary, ships are becoming reliant on supply vessels for water, but delivering much needed supplies under the current conditions is a logistical challenge. 14 vessels were abandoned by their owners. Without wages of supplies, they are totally reliant on the mission to Seafarers for support.

The psychological impact on these seafarers is immeasurable.'

Since this was written, some ships have been able to pass through, but under great threat for their safety.

Keep these seafarers in your prayers and keep bringing in your beanies, gloves, socks, toiletries, and other care items. Thank you to those who have already done so.
