Psalm 137

By the waters of Babylon we sat down and wept: when we remembered Zion.

A reading from 2 Timothy Chapter 1, verses 1 to 14

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus,

To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I

Mission Report - 6th October 2013

In Australia we are blessed to live in a nation that essentially offers a relatively safe environment for us to raise our families. In recent weeks the Parish has received information from both ABM and World Vision on the ongoing crisis in Syria.

ABM launched - Syria Emergency Appeal, and is hoping to raise \$10,000 to provide relief to many of the casualties, internally displaced persons and refugees which continually grow in and around Syria as a result of the civil war. ABM is an Associate Member of ACT Alliance, which is coordinating the humanitarian response.

Tim Costello - World Vision Australia Chief Executive, reminds us of the children and families whose lives have been turned upside down by the ongoing conflict, and the refugees forced to flee for their lives, with just the clothes they were wearing when they fled Syria, and who face a life of uncertainty in refugee camps.

More than 1.7 million people have been displaced to neighbouring countries. Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq, Turkey and some North African countries have accepted the arrival of these refugees. A further 4.25 million people have been displaced within Syria, many living in makeshift shelters, and face extreme hardship, often traumatised from the extreme violence. Most families just want somewhere safe for their children to live.

Please continue to pray for

- * The people of Syria
- * The countries who have opened their borders
- * The many families who have opened their hearts and homes to host refugee families.
- * World leaders who seek to find a peaceful resolution to this long term crisis.
- * Humanitarian agencies assisting those in need, providing shelter, food vouchers, blankets, warm clothing, medical,

personal hygiene kits, fuel for heating and cooking, access to water and sanitation in the camps, and providing child-friendly he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 17. 1 - 10.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus said to his disciples, 'Occasions for stumbling are bound to come, but woe to anyone by whom they come! It would be better for you if a millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea than for you to cause one of these little ones to stumble. Be on your guard! If another disciple sins, you must rebuke the offender, and if there is repentance, you must forgive. And if the same person sins against you seven times a day, and turns back to you seven times and says, "I repent", you must forgive.'

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!' The Lord replied, 'If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.

'Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, "Come here at once and take your place at the table"? Would you not rather say to him, "Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink"? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, "We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!" '
