A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles Chapter 9, verses 36 to 43

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

- Planning Meeting for a Messy Church Baptism 11th May The beginnings of the Messy Church movement in England was energised by a passion for embracing young families into church life through gatherings which were utterly grounded in teaching the Christian faith and by doing so in ways that children and their parents found compelling. And authentic Christian witness can't help but be deeply relational. Probably one of the most profound expressions of our Christian identity as being relational is both given and sustained in Holy Baptism. Therein we name, claim, celebrate and commit to God's sacrificial, sublime and most loving gift of himself to us in Jesus - the ultimate, perfect and life-breathing gift of relationship. On Saturday 11th May the Messy Church team will be considering the demands of and possibilities for baptism in the context of the Messy Church experience.
- The Messy Church Baptism will take place on Sunday 19th May from 3.30pm. Interestingly, during the Presidential address to the Electoral Synod, Archdeacon Stephen Pullin made specific reference to our proposed Terrigal Messy Church baptism as a true example of the blessings and opportunities such missional work offers. Messy Church doesn't mean that we have found the magic bullet but it does mean that we are experiencing some exciting developments which are characterised by openness and energy, risk-taking and faithfulness.
- The Third Holy Trinity Patronal Festival will take place on Sunday, 26th May. Our wonderful Women's Fellowship will host the occasion (see details elsewhere) and our Trinity Band will entertain us - again behold the energy in view! From the Rector

Episcopal Election Synod

Following the Electoral Synod's deliberations last weekend the Synod failed to elect. The Diocesan Administrator, The Right Reverend Peter Stuart reported thus on the Diocesan website...

The Synod of the Diocese of Newcastle did not elect a bishop when it met from Friday 12th through to Sunday 14th April 2013.

The Synod expressed its gratitude to Archdeacon Stephen Pullin for his presidency of Synod and I have done so again.

The Synod expressed its gratitude to all of the candidates who allowed themselves to be considered.

Sometimes the Synod elects quickly and sometimes the process takes time. Synod elected Bishops Farran (2005) and Holland (1977) in one sitting. Synod elected Bishop Herft (1992) over two Synod sessions and refereed the decision to elect a bishop in 1972 to the Diocesan Council which elected Bishop Shevill.

The Synod resolved to begin the process afresh but has asked for the opportunity to amend the procedure before then. I will be taking some advice and then making some announcements about the Synod dates in the next week.

Ordinarily a new election Synod would meet after a ninety day period during which nominations are sought, relevant information is circulated and a prayerful vigil is maintained.

During this extend interregnum the Diocesan Administrator will continue to have responsibility for the appropriate and canonical stewardship of the Diocese.
